7TH SESSION OF THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS

LOME , 22 - 25 MAY 1980

The Seventh Meeting of the Council of Ministers of ECOWAS was held from the 22nd - 25th of May, 1980, in the building of the Rassemblement du Peuple Togolais (RPT) in Lomé, Republic of Togo. All Member States were represented. The following international Organisations were also represented at this meeting as observers:

- Organisation of African Unity (OAU)
- Economic Commission for Africa (ECA)
- West African Economic Community (CEAO/WAEC)
- Central Banque of West African States (BCEAO)
- Mano River Union (MUR)
- African Development Bank (ADB)
- Federation of West African Chambers of Commerce (FWACC)

The list of participants is attached as Annex 1 of this report.

2. OPENING

The meeting was opened by Honourable Koudjolou DOGO, Minister for Planning and Administrative Reforms of the Republic of Togo, who welcomed the Ministers and members of their delegation to Lome, on behalf of the People of Togo, their Party - the Rassemblement du Peuple Togolais, its Government and His Excellency General Gnassingbe EYADEMA, President Lofounder of the RPT and President of the Republic of Togo. He expressed satisfaction with the appeal made by the First Economic Summit of the OAU held in Lagos from 29 - 30 April, 1980 to other sub-regions of the continent requesting them to take ECOWAS as an example of sub-regional economic integration. He gave a summary of the activities of the Community since the last session of the Council held in Dakar in November 1979 and expressed the wish that the

deliberations of the current session would be held in the best conditions (see Annex II on Opening Speech).

Responding to the Opening Speech, Mr. Serigne Lamine DIOP, Senegalese Minister for Trade expressed his thanks on behalf of his colleagues to the People of Togo, the Government and their President for the warm and brotherly reception accorded delegations and the excellent facilities put at their disposal for the success of the deliberations of the Council. He transmitted a message from the President of the Republic of Senegal and current Chairman of the Authority, His Excellency Mr. Leopold Sédar SENGHOR, wishing the Council success in its deliberations.

Referring to the recent OAU Economic Summit held in Lagos at which it was decided that sub-regional economic communities such as ECOWAS should be established in North, Central and East Africa with a view to attaining an African Common Market by the year \$600 A.D., the Honourable Minister expressed his elation at the fact that ECOWAS was cited as a model. He urged all Member States of ECOWAS to dedicate themselves to the service of the Community and to ensure that ECOWAS is not only a reality but a success. Finally, the Senegalese Minister congratulated President EYADEMA on the bold steps he has taken to help restore peace to the warri-torus Pepublicowiff Charl.

He further congratulated him on his pending assumption of the Chairmanship of the Authority of Heads of State and Covernment of ECOWAS.

- 5. REFORT OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

The Executive Secretary in his report to Council dwelt among other things on the following items:

- Life of the Community since the last Session of the Council:
 - (i) Running of the Institutions since the last Session of the Council
 - (ii) Issues emanating from the deliberations of the Technical Commissions
- General Review of Progress of the Community since its inception

The Council took note of the report of the Executive Secretary and requested him to undertake a study on the decision making process of competent authorities of the Community and the entry into force of these decisions. It also requested him to do everything possible to ensure the printing and regular distribution of the Community Gazette.

The Council congratulated the Executive Secretary and his staff for their sense of devotion to the cause of the Community.

6. REPORT OF THE TECHNICAL COMMISSIONS

A. Consideration of the Report of the Trade,
Immigration, Customs, Monetary and Payments
Commission

On the proposal of the Chairman of the Council of Ministers, discussions were limited to items on which reservations were made during the meeting of the Commission or those on which experts could not agree. They are the following issues:

- Compensation Procedure for Loss of Revenue Suffered by Member States as a result of Trade Liberalisation
- Intra-Community Trade Liberalisation
- Fish and Fish Products

(i) Compensation Procedure for Loss of Revenue

The Council took note of reservations made by Senegal, Nigeria and Ghana concerning the deduction of a quarter of the compensation resulting from the loss of revenue suffered by the four more developed Member States (Ivory Coast, Ghana, Nigeria, Senegal) to be put exclusively at the disposal of the twelve less developed countries during the first eight years of the trade liberalisation. The Council decided to refer the issue to the Authority of Heads of State and Government during its coming session.

(11) Trade Liberalisation in Industrial Products

The Council examined and adopted the draft recommendation relating to Trade Liberalisation in Industrial Products on condition that studies be undertaken on the following before the entry into force of the liberalisation programme.

- Classification of Import Duties and Taxes as well as indirect internal taxes and duties
- Application of the most favoured nation clause (Article 20 of the ECOWAS Treaty) in respect of other sub-regional organisations in West Africa;
- Definition of the Status of the Community Enterprises and their legal framework.

The results of these studies should be submitted to Council during its next session.

Besides, Council was informed of the request made by the West African Economic Community (CEAO) asking for a derogation for a period of seven years from the application of the most favoured nation clause. The Council took note of this information.

(iii) Fish and Fish Products

The Council rejected the proposal of the Commission that an amendment be made to Article 3 of the Protocol of the concept of originating products from Member States in order to confer Community origin on fishery products obtained by vessels chartered by an enterprise or a State company of a Member State. It requested the Executive Secretary to convene a meeting of the appropriate Commission that will try to find a solution for countries which cannot satisfy conditions stipulated in paragraph 4 of Article 3 of the Protocol relating to the definition of the concept of originating products.

- B. Consideration of the Report of the Transport,
 Telecommunications and Energy Commission
- 1. Report of the Sub-Commission on Transport

The Council considered and adopted the report of the Sub-Commission on Transport after the following amendment

The Executive Secretariat was charged with the monitoring of the development and maintenance of the regional transport infrastructures.

2. Report of the Sub-Commission on Telecommunications

After taking note with satisfaction of the Report of the Sub-Commission, the Council authorised the Executive Secretariat to continue with the implementation of the Priority Development Programme on Telecommunications adopted in Dakar in May, 1979, and recommended to the Authority of Heads of State and Government the setting up of a Special Fund for Telecommunications.

- i) With regard to the 1% Community tax to be levied on subscribers' bills, the Executive Secretary was requested to present a new proposal to the Council at its next session.
- ii) The Council of Ministers recommended to the Board of Directors of the ECOWAS Fund to allocate to or guarantee the Special Fund for Telecommunications an amount of 5 million United States Dollars.
- iii) On the implementation of the Priority Programme,
 Council requested the Executive Secretary to make
 necessary contacts with sources of finance and
 to report to the next session on the financing
 of these operations.

C. Consideration of the Report of the Industry, Agriculture and Natural Resources Commission

(i) Agriculture Programme

Council adopted the Agricultural Programme as proposed by the Commission.

(ii) Industrial Programme

After verifying and confirming that the Executive Secretary had been given the mandate to conduct studies on this programme, the Council however postponed the consideration of these studies to the next session because these studies had not been previously considered by the experts of Member States. The Council explained to the Executive Secretary that he could continue with the studies started on this programme, but should in future ensure that he follows the normal procedure for studies. In this regard, he was called upon to immediately convene the Committee of Experts so as to avoid any development which might be detrimental to the expeditious and rational implementation of the programme.

D. Consideration of the Report of the Social and Cultural Affairs Commission

On the Bilingual Institute of Management and Public Administration, the Council while accepting, in principle, the idea of establishing such an institution, decided to defer the project for the time being not only for budgetary reasons but also because of the fact that similar institutions exist in some Member States of the Community.

7. REPORT OF THE FINANCIAL CONTROLLER

Council felt that the Report of the Financial Controller did not reflect all the different accounts of the Institutions of the Community. However, it took note of the said report pending the final document relating to the account that will be prepared and presented during its next session.

On the delay encountered in the payment of contributions, Council strongly requested Member States to make their contributions available without further delay and to fulfil their commitments in future.

Concerning the problem of housing professional staff, Council directed those staff members to occupy the premises rented for them.

8. REMUNERATION OF THE EXTERNAL AUDITOR

Council mandated its Chairman to negotiate with the External Auditor on the amount for his remuneration.

9. SUPPLEMENTARY BUDGET FOR THE SECRETARIAT

Council adopted the report of the Financial Experts containing two supplementary budgets for research relating to agriculture and transport.

Concerning the budget on post adjustment scheme for the staff of the Community and leave allowance for the supporting staff, the Council requested the Executive Secretariat to further examine the issue and make new proposals during its next session.

10. COOPERATION AGREEMENT

A number of delegations pointed out that the already existing cooperation between ECOWAS and the sub-regional Organisations should be followed up by the Executive Secretary without necessarily going into any formal agreement. The Council called upon the Executive Secretary in the form of a resolution to establish a dynamic policy of cooperation with the sub-regional organisations.

Other delegations, on the contrary, felt it was necessary to sign such a formal agreement. In the absence of a concensus it was finally decided to refer the matter to the Authority of Heads of State and Government.

II. REPLACEMENT OF THE DEPUTY EXECUTIVE SECRETARY RESPONSIBLE FOR ECONOMIC AFFAIRS

The Souncil endorsed the nomination of Dr. SAKHO Dakoum, Dean of the faculty of Economics of the University of Conakry as the new Deputy Executive Secretary responsible for Economic Affairs proposed by the People's Revolutionary Republic of Guinea in replacement of Dr. Riawa-Mory TRAORE. Council expressed its thanks to Dr Traore for services rendered to the Community and congratulated him for his new propetion.

12. ANY OTHER MATTERS

The Council was informed of the request made by the Customs Cooperation Council to make available the ECOWAS Nomenclature to the rest of Africa and gave its approval.

13. VOTE OF THANKS

The Council adopted a Vote of Thanks expressing its profound gratitude to His Excellency General Gnassingbe EYADEMA, Founding Father of the Togelese People's Rally and President of the Republic of Toge.

The Council further extended its appreciation to the People and Government of Togo for their warm hospitality and the excellent facilities put at their disposal.

14. ADOPTION OF THE REPORT

The Council adopted the Report of its seventh session.

DECISION N° 1 RELATING TO THE SEGREGATION OF MATERIALS

(ARTICLE VII OF THE PROTOCOL RELATING TO THE DEFINITION OF
THE CONCEPT OF PRODUCTS ORIGINATING FROM MEMBER STATES)

THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS

MINDFUL of Article 6 of the ECOWAS Treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and determining its composition and functions;

MINDFUL of Article VII of the Protocol relating to the definition of the concept of products originating from Member States:

DECIDES

Article 1

In order to ensure that there is not more of any goods considered to be originating than if the producer were able to segregate physically the materials used in the production process and in order to be able to efficiently check facts stated on the Certificate of Origin, industrial enterprises producing goods eligible for Community originating status shall adopt an accounting system which makes possible a distinction between the quantity of originating and non-originating materials used in the production of any given goods.

Article 2

The Accounting system shall provide for the following information:

- date of receipt and date of release for use of the material;
- characteristics of the material;
- quantity or volume of the material;
- reference period.

Article 3

The present Decision shall come into force upon signature and shall be published in the Official Journal of the Community and the National Gazette of each Member State.

DECISION NO.2 RELATING TO RULES APPLICABLE TO MIXTURES (ARTICLE VIII OF THE PROTOCOL RELATING TO THE DEFINITION OF THE CONCEPT OF ORIGINATING PRODUCTS)

THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS

MINDFUL of Article 6 of the Treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and defining its composition and functions:

MINDFUL of Article VIII of the Protocol relating to the definition of the concept of products originating from Member States

DECIDES

ARTICLE 1

In the case of particular products resulting from the mixing of goods originating from Member States and goods not so originating as provided under sub-section 2 of the said Article, the Council of Ministers shall prescribe, upon request from Member States and on the recommendation of the Commission, the conditions under which the particular product may be accepted as originating from the Community. The Council may also specify whether only part

or whole of the product may be granted Community originating status.

ARTICLE 2

The present Decision shall come into force upon signature and shall be published in the Official Journal of the Community and the National Gazette of each Member State.

DECISION NO. 3 RELATING TO THE PROOF AND THE VERIFICATION OF THE COMMUNITY ORIGIN OF PRODUCTS AND PROCEDURES RELATING TO THE CIRCULATION OF GOODS WITHIN THE COMMUNITY

MINDFUL of Article 6 of the Treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and defining its composition and functions,

D E C I D E S

Article 1

The Member States hereby undertake to apply the Rules relating to the Proof and the Verification of the Community Origin as well as the procedures applicable to the movement of procucts within the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) which have been defined in the document annexed to this Decision.

Article 2

The Executive Secretary shall take all necessary measures to ensure that the above-mentioned Rules are effectively implemented by the Member States.

Article 3

The present Decision shall come into force upon signature and shall be published in the Official Journal of the Community and in the National Gazette of each Member State.
